
It was a life crisis that award-winning author, Pamela Christian, suffered that caused her to realize that she'd been woefully deceived in her basic beliefs about life and the human existence. Some years later when reading an article from ABC News about Americans being surprisingly tolerant of religious faith, she found herself outraged and instantly knew she had to do something to address the widespread deception. Christian explains:

I expected to read that Americans are tolerant of people having faith in religions different from their own. Instead I learned that Americans are attempting to take various tenets of different religious beliefs to create a "religion" of their own. This is deception of the worst kind. And the sad part is that those who are deceived are unaware. That is the very nature of deception. Unless someone respectfully gets in their face or they suffer a crisis of their own, they could die deceived. Why put yourself in line for a crisis when my life experience and book can help?

This book is written for those who are not confident about what truth is, who believe there has to be a more confident way to live, who struggle with the many conflicting truth claims, and who are willing to reconsider their own beliefs. Christian begins the book exploring the claim that truth is relative. Through logic and reason, Christian presents the case that truth being absolute has far greater merit. Then she presents an overview of the basic tenets of the five major world religions and the New Age movement, to demonstrate that these religions cannot be blended without some serious compromise. Next, using extra-biblical historical evidence, she presents compelling reason to conclude that the Bible is unique as contrasted to all other documents of religious authority. From this collective premise, she compellingly considers the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, asking the reader one last questions, "Will you believe?"
