- 1. First we need to practice the presence of God, which is to look for God in all matters and circumstances. Instead of noticing the work of the enemy concentrate on the workings of God.
- 2. Second, we should utilize many different opportunities of worship, when we are alone, when in church, when in small groups. We can worship God anytime and anywhere.

- 3. Third, we should find ways to truly prepare for worship, deliberately focusing our hearts and minds on Christ, intentionally putting the cares of the world aside. Arrive early to the place of worship to calm your heart and center your mind.
- 4. Fourth, approach worship with a willingness to experience the power of the Lord. Literally express your welcome of the Holy Spirit, invite Hm to make His presence known.
- 5. Fifth, we need to cultivate a holy dependency, recognize and intentionally be wholly surrendered to God and dependent on God. We should concentrate on the realities that only in Him can we move, and live and have our being.
- 6. Sixth, absorb distractions with gratitude. Instead of being annoyed, learn to conquer the disruption maintaining the spirit of worship. Distractions are intended by the enemy of God to interrupt our worship of God. Don't let the enemy have the victory.
- 7. Seventh, learn to offer a sacrifice of worship which is to worship when you don't feel like it. When we have just experienced a major blow, and worship is not our first natural response, deliberately choose to respond with your spirit and worship the Lord, confident He will give you the victory.
